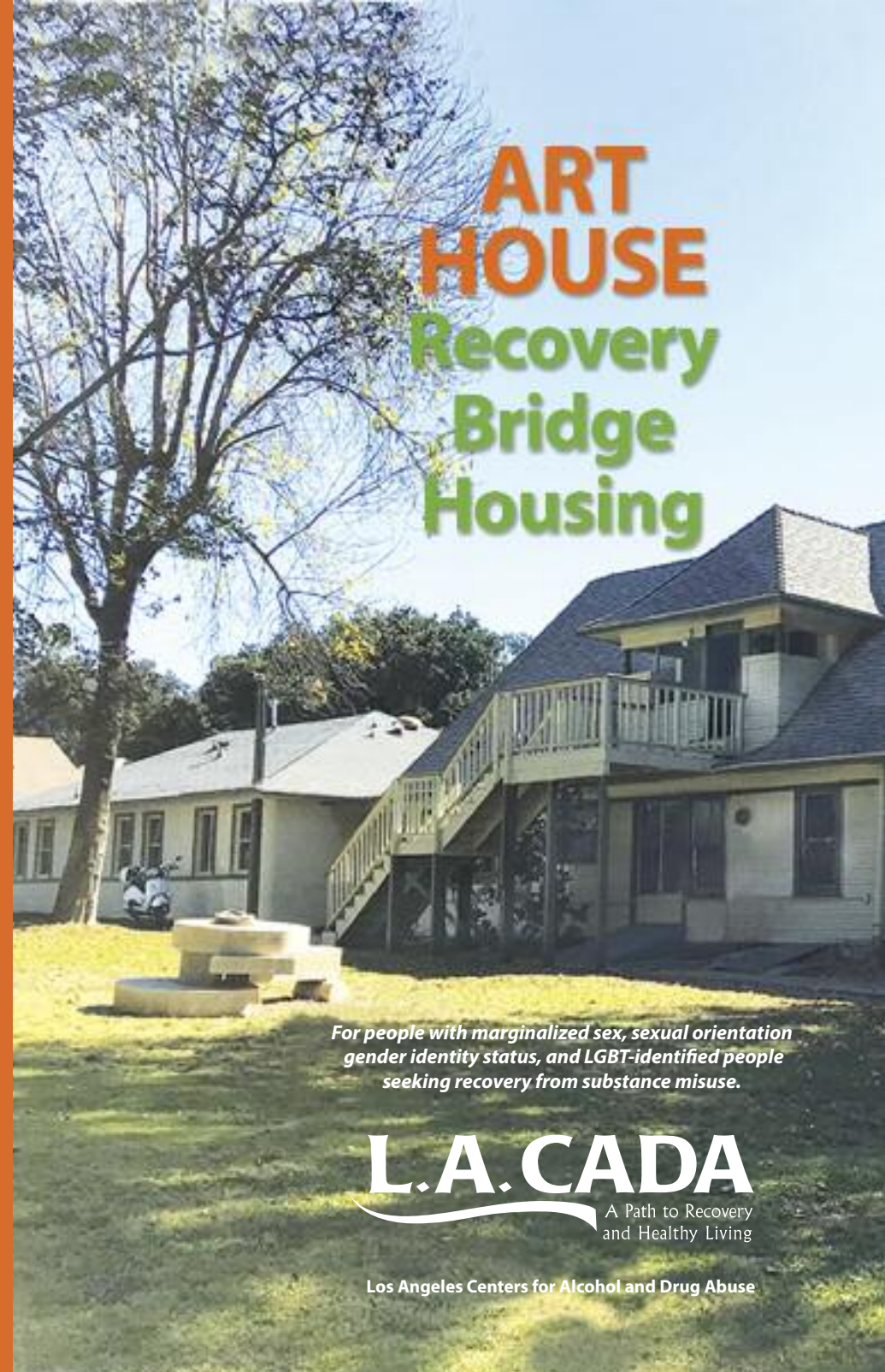

# ART HOUSE Recovery Bridge Housing



*For people with marginalized sex, sexual orientation  
gender identity status, and LGBT-identified people  
seeking recovery from substance misuse.*

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## Recovery Bridge Housing

In northwest Pasadena, below the foothills of Altadena, ART House is situated on a large, private lot close to public transportation, health services, and green park space. We can comfortably accommodate up to 16 residents at a time.

ART House is a Recovery Bridge Housing (RBH) program that provides a safe interim living environment for people who are homeless and are in intensive outpatient (IOP) or outpatient (OP) treatment to address substance-related issues. RBH services are free to our residents.

People can access 90 days of RBH housing per year. We assist our residents in navigating the Coordinated Entry System (CES) with a goal of obtaining permanent housing before they leave ART House.

ART House has been conceptualized to meet the needs of populations who have marginalized sex characteristics, sexual orientation, and/or gender identities (ie: LGBT). We ensure a home environment which is consciously trauma-informed, intentionally affirming of our multiple, often intersecting, identities, and encouraging artistic/creative self-expression.

We are invested in healthy community-building and social justice. ART House is a space free of societal stigma, discrimination and marginalization, in which our residents can recuperate from the minority stresses that plague our lives, and from which our residents can begin to unpack and address internalized -isms and implicit/subconscious bias and shame.

## Our Vision

Together with and for people who have been marginalized because of their sexual orientation or gender identity, ART House will provide an environment where whole person safety and well-being can be realized through creative expression and discourse directed at individual health, building supportive communities, and celebrating our cultural diversity.

## Our Mission

ART House is a recovery component which usually remains unacknowledged in traditional treatment programs. We exist to provide:

- Creation of intentional safe space
- Respite from the larger, often oppressive, culture
- Shared, yet specific internal work as a critical core component in the recovery and well-being of populations

## Our Partners



Most of our participants are in our field-based OP/IOP treatment program housed at the AT Center in Hollywood. For almost 50 years, this has been the center of the recovering LGBT community and lifeline for many in need. Treatment together has promoted social cohesion at the RBH. It also helps us surround our participants with M-SSOGL recovery and community.



We also collaborate with Van Ness House where we've worked on developing culturally appropriate and identity-affirming policies and procedures. We cross-refer people to and from our programs.
